

## **Home First Aid Kit Checklist General Supplies**

[] Adhesive bandages (various sizes)
[] Gauze pads (various sizes)
[] Adhesive cloth tape
[] Antiseptic wipes
[] Antibiotic ointment
[] Hydrocortisone cream (1%)
[] Aloe vera gel (for first-degree burns)
[] Instant cold packs or resealable plastic bags for ice
[] Triangular bandages (for slings)
[] Elastic bandage roll (Ace wrap)
[] Tweezers
[] Scissors
[] Digital thermometer
[] Latex-free gloves
[] Face shield for CPR
[] Saline solution or wound wash
[] First aid guidebook (American Red Cross or similar)
[] Low-dose aspirin (baby aspirin)
Optional Medications
. [] Ibuprofen or acetaminophen
[] Antihistamines (diphenhydramine/Benadryl)
[] Antacids
[] Antidiarrheal (loperamide)
[] Cough suppressant/decongestant
Special Considerations
[] Non-latex gloves and bandages (if latex allergy)
[] Condition-specific supplies (inhaler, epinephrine auto-injector, etc.)
[1] Condition opening dapplies (initials), opiniophinic data injector, etc.)
4 C's of Wound Care
- Clean - Rinse with clean water or saline solution
- Coat - Apply a thin layer of antibiotic ointment
- Cover - Use a sterile bandage

Tip: Review your kit twice a year and replace any expired or used items. Get trained in First Aid, CPR, and AED use so you'll know exactly what to do in an emergency.

- Call - Seek medical attention if needed
