## **Day 1: Foundations & Primary Systems**

#### Module 1: Introduction to Wilderness Medicine (.25 hrs)

- Course goals & expectations
- Legal concepts: Duty to Act, Consent, Scope of Practice
- Wilderness vs Urban response differences

#### Module 2: Scene Size-Up & Patient Assessment System (PAS) (1.5 hrs)

- Scene safety, PPE, MOI
- Initial Survey: R-ABCDE
- Focused Survey: Head to Toe, Vitals (LOR, HR, RR, Skin), SAMPLE history
- SOAP Note

#### **Module 3: Basic Life Support Skills (1.25 hrs)**

- Unconscious patient, altered mental status
- Bleeding control: direct pressure, tourniquets, wound packing, hemostatic agents
- Body temperature maintenance
- Spinal Injury

### Module 4: Shock & Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) (1 hr)

- Shock
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Concussions

### Module 5: Musculoskeletal Injuries & Splinting (1 hr)

- Stable vs unstable injuries
- Splinting
- Traction
- Dislocations

- Bleeding control

## Day 2: Environmental & Medical Emergencies

#### Module 6: Environmental Injuries – Cold & Heat, Others (2.5 hrs)

- Hypothermia: mild, moderate, severe
- Hypothermia wrap construction
- Heat Exhaustion vs Heat Stroke: prevention & cooling
- Hyponatremia vs Dehydration
- Lightning injuries
- Drowning
- Allergies & anaphylaxis (Epi Administrator Certificate)
- Toxins & vector-borne illnesses

#### Module 8: Wounds, Burns, & Soft Tissue Injuries (1 hr)

- Wound cleaning/irrigation, Infections
- Burn assessment & treatment
- Bites, stings, impaled objects
- Blisters, and eviscerations

#### Module 9: Medical Emergencies (1 hr)

- Asthma, chest pain, diabetes, stroke, seizures
- Abdominal complaints & acute abdomen
- Systemic infection & sepsis
- Evacuation guidelines

- Multiple patient trauma/medical simulations
- Scene management, treatment, communication, evacuation
- SOAP note & patient handoff practice
